June Means Back to School in Myanmar



Children living at Loving Fountain in Myitkyina join millions of other school children as they head back to school. Asian Children's Mission continues to operate a number of preschools (Hwambi, Mandalay, Pwin Oo Lwin, Putao), as well as lead or assist with elementary, middle and high schools. Additionally, our nursing school will accept its next class this month.

Youth Hostel and Church Plant for Mro—Unreached People Group



The city of Bon Naa Kyun has over 100,000 people — and not one church. That changes with the establishment of a youth hostel for high school students from the Mro ethnic group. These young people will leave their rural villages to attend high school while living at the hostel. On Sundays, worship services will be held led by a first generation Mro Christian who is a well respected evangelist among his people. Only about five percent of Mro are Christians. The remainder are Buddhist or animists. To the left is Mro Evangelist and Hostel leader Bzan Bzan, helping to enroll a new Mro student.

First Joshua School Slated to Open in October



Training in Yangon continues for our teachers and therapists to be ready to open our first Joshua School for disabled children in October.
